## The Purposes of God

At this point we need to take off our shoes because we are treading on holy ground. While we can be fairly certain that God does have His purposes, they belong to Him. While He knows what they are, we can only speculate. There is no attempt to be dogmatic about these issues, but it is quite possible that the ideas expressed on this page are essentially correct. We must wait patiently until the day of judgment to find out the whole and perfect truth. What follows is just my personal view of what God's purposes may well be.

One of the basic assumptions of this website is that all things were created by God. It was not that God was lonely (see 'Why the Holy Trinity?'), but for His own glory He created the angels to populate the spiritual world He inhabits, the world which we call Heaven.
